

# Gold Canyon intersects high grade gold in new zone at Springpole

Gold Canyon Resources Inc. (TSX-V:GCU) recently concluded their 2006 winter drill program at the Springpole Gold Project located 115 kilometres east-northeast of Red Lake. The company is reporting that although warmer than normal winter temperatures hampered exploration activities, they were very encouraged by results of completed diamond drilling at the property .

The remote project area is located south of Birch Lake at Springpole Lake and is accessible via air or winter road which connects the property to the South Bay

Road. This year, mild weather initially delayed construction of the winter road and also forced the company to cut its program short, completing 21 of 27 scheduled holes for a total of 9,029 feet of the 11,000 feet planned.

On April 13, 2006 the company released results from the first eight holes of the 2006 program, commenting that they were, "...very encouraged by confirmation of bonanza grade results in the Core Area which include 8.0 feet at 1.518 ounces per ton gold (opt Au) in hole BL06-356," confirmed the news release. "In addition preliminary exploration drilling within the 2.5 kilometer (1.5 miles) long Southwest Target Area has

identified mineralization assaying 0.449 opt Au over 3.0 feet a larger 12.0 interval averaging 0.172 opt Au in hole BL06-357."

The Southwest Target Area represents a totally new exploration area situated 1.6 kilometers west southwest of the Core Area which has been the site of intensive exploration activities by Gold Canyon in previous years. The company is reporting that three holes drilled into this new target area encountered significant gold mineralization.

The company remains optimistic that this is only the first of a number of new target zones to be identified and tested outside of the historical focus of the property.
